Description: A professional archaeologist Anne studied at Durham before becoming a Research Assistant for English Heritage. After completing a masters at St Andrews she returned to Durham University to take up a research fellowship and complete a PhD (subsequently published) in maritime archaeology. She directed and published excavations at Old Durham Gardens. She twice won Fellowship awards from the National Maritime Museum and was based for part of this work at the then North of England Museums Service before becoming an editor at Newcastle University. She has been a guest lecturer at Newcastle University (Institute of Cultural and Heritage Studies, MA in Museums Studies & Heritage Management) and the Department of Archaeology and a lecturer at the Durham University (Centre for Lifelong Learning).

Through teaching adults, Anne developed an interest in educational theory and inspiring learning. She has a Certificate in Education (FE) from New College Durham and helped to develop and deliver the first Certificate in Teaching and Learning in HE for new teaching staff at Newcastle University. She has regularly delivered study skills training for the Newcastle University Mature Students Orientation Programme.
